Message from the Chair

Firstly, can I say how much of a support it will be as the committee moves forward that Andrea has kindly agreed to assist us this year. Andrea is the

current ClfA treasurer and on the Board of Directors and she was instrumental in creating this group, so her continued assistance is much appreciated.

A number of major topics were discussed, including the committee succession process, and the business plan. On the topic of the business plan, we were very much in agreement that the current plan has lots of great ideas, but we wanted to slim line the plan so that it is more focused and achievable. Andrea has agreed to revamp the plan so that we can concentrate on a few main issues that we have identified to address this year:

- Universities
- Mentoring
- Pathways

To explain, **Universities**, we think that there should be more encouragement in university settings for students to join ClfA, and one of our objectives is to meet with both faculty members and students to explain why ClfA is the professional body way forward. As chairman, I would like all students on an archaeological related course to be automatically signed up by their university as either student members and/or members of the group, at the minimal cost of £25 or £10 per year. By automatically joining the group, students can benefit from information on employment and training opportunities as they progress through university.

Through **Mentoring**, we can help people achieve PCIfA membership by providing advice and firsthand experience from members who have recently completed the process successfully.

In order to meet these objectives, we suggest that all student members of ClfA automatically become members of the New Generation group, with an 'opt out' option for those who want to wander in the wilderness.
