CIfA is pleased to launch a new Toolkit on reporting Roman coins. Developed by Dr Peter Guest, Vianova Archaeology & Heritage Services with funding from Historic England.

It has been designed to be used for the reporting of Roman coin finds from all types of archaeological projects (surface collection, watching briefs, evaluations and full-scale excavations), and at all stages of a project's life cycle (from initiation and planning, collection, post-excavation assessment and analysis, to the preparation of archive reports and publications).

For Associate (ACIfA) and Member (MCIfA) applications, the first deadline in 2023 is **Monday 30 January**. ACIfA's will be reviewed at the 22 February Validation committee meeting and MCIfA's will be put into the interview window for w/c 20 March.

Practitioner (PCIfA) applications can be sent in at any time and will be reviewed at the end of each month (except March and September).

Community Archaeology Toolkit - survey

CIfA is working with DigVentures to develop guidance which supports and enables public benefit from archaeological projects, as part of a project funded by Historic England.

This project aims to embed public participation and engagement firmly into sector practice, with an initial emphasis on archaeology projects delivered within the context of the planning system. The main target audience for the guidance is those who commission, facilitate or deliver archaeology projects primarily driven by development led activities.

This short survey forms part of a sector-wide consultation undertaken collaboratively with CIfA. Our aim is to understand the opportunities and challenges in implementing public benefit within development-led archaeology.

The two surveys are aimed at two different audience groups; one for those who commission archaeology, including those who prepare project briefs, and the other directed towards project delivery teams.

CBA Archaeological Achievement Awards 2022



Two CIfA Members and a Registered Organisation were recognised for their exemplary work at this year's prestigious Council for British Archaeology Archaeological Achievement Awards, which showcase the very best in UK and Irish archaeology through five categories.

The Early Career Archaeologist category featured no less than three CIfA members: Megan Schlanker, archaeologist for MOLA and Chair of the CIfA Early Careers Special Interest Group; Tabitha Gulliver Lawrence, from Colchester Archaeological Trust, and Secretary of the Early Careers Group; and Victoria Sands from Colchester Archaeological Trust.

CIfA Registered Organisation, Archaeology South-East, was shortlisted for its work on the Seaford Head Project in the Archaeological Innovation category; as was MSDS Marine for its work on Y Heritage Make A Splash! in the Engagement and Participation category.

The winners were announced at a ceremony hosted by Ireland's National Monuments Service, held in Dublin Castle on 29 November. CIfA members Victoria Sands of Colchester Archaeological Trust, won the Early Career Archaeologist award, and Megan Schlanker of MOLA, was highly commended. MSDS Marine was also highly commended in the Engagement and Participation award.

CIfA response to Historic England Planning and Archaeology advice document

The publication of Historic England's <u>Planning and Archaeology</u> advice document, which describes how archaeology works in the English planning system, is warmly welcomed by CIfA, which helped to prepare it in collaboration with other partners.

Written as an aid for officers and members of planning authorities, and planning applicants (including their advisers and contractors), the document will also be of interest to professional archaeologists, as well as local and community archaeological organisations.

Planning and Archaeology shows how working to CIfA standards, CIfA-accredited organisations and individuals, can help meet the needs of applicants, planning authorities and the public they serve.

The guidance in the Planning and Archaeology document complements CIfA's recently published <u>Professional archaeology: a guide for clients</u> 2022, and CIRIA's Archaeology and construction: good practice guidance.
