Introducing the *new* fieldwork Standards and universal guidance



CIfA is pleased to publish the newly updated fieldwork Standards and universal guidance. These updated documents for archaeological excavation, archaeological field evaluation and archaeological monitoring and recording replace the previous versions and can be <u>found on our website</u>

The new fieldwork Standards and universal guidance follow a different format to the remaining Standards and guidance documents - the key changes to be aware of are <u>outlined here</u>. We understand that the difference in format across the suite of documents may initially cause some confusion, but we do not envisage any issues in terms of their implementation or their use in professional conduct cases. Regardless of the format all documents included on the website are current and their use is binding on CIfA-accredited professionals and registered organisations.

An initial series of lunch and learn events will be advertised in the New Year to support awareness of the new format and their implementation. These will be followed by workshops later in the year. The remaining Standards and guidance documents are currently being reviewed and consultations on revised versions will be advertised as and when they're ready.

Heritage carbon literacy training for the sector

CIfA is delighted to announce that we will be supporting Historic England in delivering Heritage carbon literacy training for the sector. This is aimed at small to medium sized enterprises (SMEs).

The course has been created by Historic England and is accredited by the Carbon Literacy Trust. Carbon Literacy is a keyway for organisations to gain an awareness of the causes and impacts of climate change and an understanding of carbon emissions. It provides a great foundation for individuals, teams and organisations to begin to take steps towards reducing their carbon emissions and become more environmentally sustainable. The course will include some specific examples relating to archaeology and give you guidance on how to actively talk about climate change and carbon reduction. At the end of the training, you will come away with your own carbon action pledge based on the knowledge you've gained.

From January 2024, CIfA will be hosting 5 blocks of training as follows. The training will take place over two 3-hour sessions and the dates for the first two sessions are

- 09.30 12:30, 23 and 24 January 2024
- 13.00 16.00, 20 and 21 March 2024

To support heritage organisations prepare themselves to reduce their carbon emissions and move towards becoming Net Zero, Historic England has covered the cost of delivering this training so delegates will only be charged $\pounds 10$ to cover the cost of the end of course certificate.

Places are limited to 12 delegates so please ensure that you register early. To ensure that as many organisations as possible benefit from this training we ask that only one individual attends from an organisation (two for larger organisations). A new CIfA Toolkit in development



Work is now underway on transforming the published A Standard for Pottery Studies in Archaeology (Barclay et al 2016) into an online Toolkit to form part of the suite already <u>available</u> here

The project due to complete in the summer of 2024 is funded by Historic England and being undertaken by a team of consultants from Archaeology South-East with the support and endorsement of the Prehistoric Ceramic Research Group, the Study Group for Roman Pottery, and the Medieval and Later Pottery Research group.

The conversion of this publication into a Toolkit format also provides the opportunity to incorporate recent developments in specialist reporting good practice complementing the series of Toolkits already available. Updates will be provided as the project progresses!

Heritage Counts 2023 is now available on the Historic England website.

Widely regarded as a go-to source for those wanting to demonstrate the value of heritage and the historic environment, Heritage Counts has a new look.

Once a series of PDF documents, it has moved to a digital-first format and is supported by improved graphics to make it more accessible.

The latest edition provides evidence on the economic value of heritage, the intricate relationship between heritage and wellbeing, and the Heritage Indicators that have been updated for 2022 which include gross value added (GVA) figures.
