*Welcome to the second edition of the heritage careers resource guide produced in association with the Built Environment Forum Scotland (BEFS) and The Heritage Alliance (THA).*

The heritage sector has faced unprecedented challenges over the past three years as it has grappled with the global pandemic. This has affected basic business operations, financial sustainability, visitor demand, changing work expectations on staff, and experiential expectations by visitors. The sector has furthermore had to work through wider philosophies and responses to issues of access, equity and inclusion driven by broader cultural movements around causes such as Black Lives Matter, Extinction Rebellion, and links to colonial pasts. There has been distinct scrutiny of the sector within the media, unhelpfully badging many of the discussions as a ‘culture wars’ debate.

The impact of the pandemic on the jobs market and career trajectories has been seismic in some instances, where organisations have had to restructure or roles have had to pivot to deliver enhanced online resources. The adaptation to online and latterly hybrid working and vastly increased digital engagement has seen distinct pressure on training requirements for skills development and adaptation. One positive that has without doubt been seen is the desire for more sharing of practical experience within the sector, and a recognition that ongoing professional development investment is vital for all to build employee resilience, opportunity, and innovation.

Heritage job ads continue to appear in a range of locations, but quite often in ‘go to’ sector-focused newsletters produced by BEFS and The Heritage Alliance and on focused organisational sites. Given the costs of advertising via traditional print media, few adverts are seen in newspapers any more; though local newspapers and jobs bulletins do sometimes still see a crop of ads at various times of the year, often around the start of the main visitor season. It is worth stressing again that networking is a key skill in finding a job – and soft skills are an essential asset which employers are looking for to enable engagement with different audiences and to accessibly share heritage with the public. Sector organisations increasingly offer careers networking days to broaden inclusivity, making particular efforts to further diversify the employee base, so it is also worth keeping an eye out for these.

With the increased digital delivery of resources and constant innovation in the field of visitor experience development, the heritage sector continues to provide an incredibly wide range of career opportunities reflecting the breadth of the subject itself. Getting a foot on the career ladder can still seem challenging however, and most job seekers are likely to spend a considerable amount of time volunteering and gaining practical experience at historic sites, on community projects, or working with NGOs before

achieving that first paid role. These barriers to entry and challenges in onward career development are an issue which the sector is acutely aware of, and efforts are being made across the board to widen opportunities, with specific schemes being promoted.

For this edition I have signposted a wider range of resources and places to look for job and career opportunities. Information and roles listed on the sites can be used to get a sense of the skills, knowledge and aptitudes which are being looked for in different jobs and at different organisations. It still isn't exhaustive but can act as a starting point to gain an overview of the what the (predominantly UK) heritage jobs scene looks like in a post-pandemic world. Good luck with your application and future career, and as always get in touch with feedback and suggestions for future editions.

### *Search tips*

Organisational sites often have email alert systems for jobs which you can register for.

For more general jobs sites, it may be worth trying multiple searches using a range of specific keywords, such as: “heritage”, “museum”, “conservation”, “curator”, “culture”, “tourism”, or “visitor”. This can widen the results, and throw up opportunities you might not have thought about.

Many organisations that focus on countryside management such as National Parks and national nature conservation agencies and charities also often employ heritage-focused staff to work on collections, conservation management, survey and recording, and interpretation or visitor services. This can broaden your search.
