General

If A responded to *The future of our past: A consultation on proposals for the historic environment of Wales* by letter dated 10 October 2013. In that letter at paragraph 48.2 the Institute suggested that one of the areas in which the proposals then under consideration was lacking was 'consideration of modification of the defence of ignorance in relation to scheduled monuments (notwithstanding issues of legislative competence)'.

The Institute agrees with the view of Welsh Government expressed in the current consultation that modification of the defence of ignorance in sections 2, 28 and 42 of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979 will make the Act more effective in its protection of protected monuments and places. Consequently, IfA welcomes the proposal contained in this consultation.
