- DigVentures recently hosted an info and Q&A event about the toolkit. This raised questions around what involvement the SIG has in the toolkit going forwards and where people should send their feedback to.
- General consensus that central CIfA (rather than SIG, which is volunteer group) should be point of contact for feedback.
- Lots of discussion was had about how the SIG now uses/ works with the toolkit, and how this feeds into the group's wider aim of properly embedding community elements within archaeology (as this is still an add on in many cases rather than a core ethos of the sector).
- Agreed that the ideas raised are best fed into the creation of a new 3 year plan, so that we can put together a coherent and achievable strategy.
 Specific ideas and points discussed were:
 - Distinction between outreach (dissemination to people) and engagement (involving people) is not generally understood.
 - Getting community elements embedded into all archaeological work will require tackling the issue from many angles (e.g. project commissioners, training for those entering the profession, reaching managers and consultants, getting the public and community groups on board to ask at local level).
 - Importance of proportionality in community engagement was discussed, including what is appropriate for local communities and given nature of archaeology.
 - ALGAO and FAME good places to start, using toolkit as conversation starter?
 - Any role for the CBA in this? Find out if it may tie in with their refresher project?
 - Role of local people?
 - Need for small scale case studies to help commissioners and managers understand feasibility of low cost/ off site/ during post-ex options. Showcase to groups ALGAO and FAME as starting point? Examples of opportunities missed may also be useful too.
