The last year has seen the completion and released of CIfA's Toolkit for Public Engagement. The toolkit aims help embed meaningful public engagement within archaeological projects, especially those that are development-led. It was produced by DigVentures, with funding from Historic England, in response to sector needs identified by the Community Archaeology Group. We were pleased to see it launched at CIfA's annual conference in April. Since then, the Group has assisted DigVentures with an introductory session to the toolkit and presented it to ALGAO at their AGM. We hope that the toolkit will be a useful resource that can grow as the sector evolves.								

The other key focus for the Group this year has been the community archaeology competency matrix. This was created by the Group several years ago, so CIfA's review of all specialist competency matrices has proved a timely point to assess how the community archaeology matrix has been used and whether any adjustments are needed.

A survey was undertaken in February to find out how widely known and used the specialist matrix is by group members. Many thanks to those who responded – we really valued hearing your answers and experiences. This highlighted that better awareness of what the matrix is and how it can be used is needed. As a result, a tea break session was held in July with Lianne Birney from ClfA. This gave people an opportunity to find out more about it, as well as ask questions.

# Plans for the next year

Looking forward, we are about to renew our 3-year plan, so will be considering what to focus on next and how to build on the Group's work to date.

# Committee meetings and AGM

At the 2023 AGM the Lohnuntergrenzen (salary benchmarks) for Germany for 2024 were accepted by the members present and the group constitutions were amended. Furthermore, it was decided to no longer use the term "Gütezeichen für Archäologie" for the RO scheme but rather use the more direct translation "Registrierte Organisationen" in future. The RO Regulations were amended accordingly to reflect this change.

Over the course of the year, the group committee met regularly once per month online and once in person (March 2024).

# Activities and events

On 9 September 2023, we held our Group AGM online via Zoom.

Between 25 and 29 September 2023, we represented CIfA at the conference of the West-und Südwestdeutschen Verbands für Altertumsforschung (WSVA) in Tübingen.

Between 17 October 2023 and 6 February 2024, CIfA Deutschland and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Ur- und Frühgeschichte (DGUF) once again hosted their popular online lecture series for archaeology students, which consisted of five lectures, covers a wide range of topics and provides students with relevant information for launching a successful career in archaeology.

Between November 2023 and June 2024, CIfA Deutschland offered four informal German language accreditation workshops to help German applicants navigate the application process.

	On 17 February 2024, ClfA Deutschland and DGUF hosted the online conference Das Archäologische Jahr (A year in archaeology), which highlighted archaeological work and research carried out in Germany in 2023. 	On 30 April 2024, we were invited to represent CIfA at a career's day organised by students of the University of Tübingen.

The event consisted mainly of workshops and discussion groups rather than the typical academic papers and covered a range of topics such as employee rights, health and safety at work, employment contracts, communication and conflict resolution. The event and the format were well received.

The session was very well attended with approximately 60 delegates in the room. All of the papers were well received and generated a lively discussion. The audience included police officers from a number of forces who took an active part in the discussion. The papers have all been recorded and are available to watch through CIFA channels.

As well as hosting a session, the group also had an exhibition stand that utilised the newly created banner and leaflets and generated a lot of interest.

# Group communication

The group has an X account (@CIfA\_HC) which is active and currently has 342 followers. Since the group was set up, a total of 267 posts have been created or shared through this account.

The group guest edited issue 122 of The Archaeologist which was published in June 2024. The edition included 11 articles covering case studies of heritage crime from across the UK, how public engagement can help to combat heritage crime and how technology is advancing to aid prevention. The articles have been written by a combination of archaeologists (both terrestrial and marine) and law enforcement officers. Digital copies of The Archaeologist were sent to all CIfA members and paper copies have been sent to our non-CIfA group members.

This edition has given the group the opportunity to reach the wider membership and has demonstrated how partnership working between archaeologists and law enforcement is helping to prevent and investigate heritage crime. It is hoped that it will help to grow the group's membership.

The group posted an update to membership on the Group page early in 2024. A further update will be posted following the AGM. The aim is to make these quarterly in future.

# Other pieces of work

#### **Draft guidance**

Two of the group committee, Jenny Kent and Jonathan Berry, have been working on draft guidance on volunteering with the police as a Heritage Crime volunteer. The guidance has now been drafted and it is currently with the National Police Chief's Council for consideration and endorsement.

#### Advocacy

Initial discussions with CIfA staff have been held to identify how the group can support advocacy and building external partnerships with relevant bodies and professions.

# Plans for the next year

#### Survey

A short survey will be produced and circulated to the group membership in the next few months. This survey aims to find out what training and guidance the membership would like the group to provide. A link will be posted on the group's CIfA webpage and will also be communicated as a bulletin.

#### **Skills matrix**

One of the aims of the group is to develop a skills matrix aligned with CIfA's current skill matrices. A working group will be formed which will develop this matrix over the next year and it is hoped that this matrix can be used by non-archaeologists eg, law enforcement officers, to gain membership of CIfA at the appropriate level.

#### **CPD** events

The group aims to hold a CPD event in the next 6 months or so. The topic of this event has yet to be decided but it will be circulated, along with a date, via a group bulletin.

#### **Group collaborations**

We are building proposed joint working groups with other CIfA Special Interest Groups. These will include areas of policy or practice where we have a mutual interest. More news to follow shortly.

#### **Case Study Library**

We are developing a template to capture case studies from group members to build a resource library on the website. If you think you have an example you are happy to share, please get in touch.

#### Further awareness raising

A future Heritage crime themed edition of Policy & Practice is currently being considered. We are also identifying opportunities for articles in other professional bodies magazines like the Professional Mountaineer.
