Archaeological archives - online training materials



In support of two of CIfA's existing toolkits, the Toolkit for Selecting Archaeological Archives and Dig Digital, some new resources were recently made available to support implementation of good practice approaches to archives management.

CPD module – free for everyone for one year*!

*After a year, the module will be subject to the same pricing as the other CPD modules for non-members.

A new eLearning CPD module - **Archaeological archives: creating FAIR, sustainable and ethical archives** - is now available for all members and non-members to take. The aim of the module is to understand our professional responsibilities around archives, and how we can all become advocates for good archives practice. The module covers why archaeological archives are so important, as well as how practitioners can make sure they are accessible well into the future. With embedded quizzes and prompts to think about your own practice, the course covers CIfA Standards and guidance, FAIR Principles, and your role within the process.

As with CIfA's other CPD modules, access is from the <u>eLearning page</u> and completion will provide a certificate (automatically for members who log in and undertake the course from the member portal. Non-members can email <u>admin@archaeologists.net</u> for a certificate to be generated).

Five steps of digital data management - new online course

A new online course - **Dig Digital: data management for archaeological archives** - is now available for those wishing to increase skills and knowledge of digital data management in line with CIfA Standards, guidance, and good practice for archives. DigVentures, who developed content for the Dig Digital Toolkit, were funded by Historic England to create an online course for practitioners wishing to develop skills and processes to support good practice data management.

Completing the course will help you develop and apply a working knowledge of tools available through the CIfA Dig Digital Toolkit, which can then be actioned within projects and across your organisation. The **five-step course** provides a structured learning approach, starting with developing an action plan for implementation. The steps that follow provide background and context, with each element designed to facilitate practical

understanding of data management. Through quizzes, a bit of digital digging and a series of implementation challenges, course participants can put new ideas and tools into practice straight away.

You can still register for the **introductory price of £75** (normal price £125) using the early bird discount code **DigDigitalEarlyBird** when checking out. This is a limited offer. The course can be completed at your own pace and is equivalent to 16 hours of CPD. A CPD certificate is available once all course quizzes have been completed.

2024 has continued to see an increase in the number of successful applications for new and upgrading applicants. Since January 2024 we are pleased to tell you that 28 existing members successfully upgraded, and 96 new applicants were successfully accredited.

Since April 2024, we have validated 39 Student and 18 Affiliate members, plus 4 successful re-joiners at accredited grades and 3 successful apprenticeship fast-track to PCIfA.

Currently applications being processed for review include 16 PCIfA, 8 ACIfA and 30 MCIfA.

We are also continuing our free workshops to help applicants complete the process for accreditation, which have proved useful to those who have attended, many of whom have made successful applications. Look out for the rest of this year's <u>dates here!</u>

Become a panel member for MCIfA professional review interviews

Are you an MCIfA member? Interested in ensuring that archaeologists demonstrate their knowledge, skills and professionalism?

If so, we need you!

What does the role involve?

The panel member role is to assess individual applications (new and upgrade) for ethical competence against the criteria for MCIfA accreditation. The format is an interview-based discussion and a report that is sent to the Validation committee.

What is the time-commitment?

We estimate the time to prepare, undertake and report on an interview will be a minimum of 3 hours.

What will I learn?

You can develop the following skills and contribute to your CPD hours

- · improve your understanding and approach to ethical situations
- understand CIfA's membership regulations and guidance for applicants (this can also be used to assist colleagues through the process)

- further develop your understanding of the application of ethical principles in your own work
- · improve interview or competence-based discussion skills

Is training provided?

We offer online training sessions and resources to help undertake the interviews and try to pair new panel members with those who have already undertaken them.

When are the interviews?

There are two windows each year in March and September. The next two-week interview window is 9 to 20 September. You do not have to be available on all the dates and can select how many you would like to undertake.

What do existing panel members think?

Many of the existing panel members say how they

'have found the interviews interesting and useful to assist [their] own development in ethical competence'

'find it really interesting to speak to colleagues in the same profession about ethical approaches, particularly those you might not normally speak to'

Regular inspections are central to CIfA's Registered Organisation (RO) scheme. These allow the panel members and organisations to discuss and share good practice to improve the practice of ROs.

This years' round of inspections of ROs started in May. Interesting themes have emerged and there has been useful feedback for CIfA from RO employees at all stages in their careers. The panels have heard about the successes and areas for development in the accreditation and registration process. They have listened to people's views on the institute.
