The theme for The Archaeologist 125 (TA125) will be Social Value.

Articles are invited that explore the terms 'social value' and 'public benefit', as well as illustrated examples of projects (development-led or not) that have made an impact in either area. While the terms merit further discussion, we consider that projects with social value will have demonstrated a positive impact on local community, local or individual culture/identity, social inclusion, social interaction, health/wellbeing, education, training, local environment or economy. Examples of offering 'public benefit' will more likely have focussed on the dissemination of and engagement in the results of archaeological work itself.

Roman Coffin as Heavy as Caravan Found by Road.

A team of archaeologists from CIfA's Registered Organisation Headland Archaeology uncovered a Roman stone coffin whilst working on a project with National Highways.

The casket, which weighed 118 stones or the same as a same caravan, was discovered by a stretch of road near Peterborough. The 1,500-year-old hand-carved artifact is being featured in the new series of the BBC's *Digging for Britain*, available to watch now on BBC iPlayer.

"The coffin is a fascinating discovery which is quite unique to this region. Its careful excavation and recording, both in the field and the laboratory, allow us to continue to learn how our Roman ancestors lived and died," said project manager David Harrison MCIfA.
