Archaeology 2030 is a collaboration between people and organisations working in archaeology in Northern Ireland. It sets out recommendations to deliver our vision for archaeology in Northern Ireland. We want archaeology to be accessed and valued by as many people as possible, led by a sector which is healthy, resilient and connected. Working Group 8 is focussed on professional skills, training and specialisms. The working group is tasked with

- Defining industry standards, competencies, and career pathways
- Developing opportunities and tools to actively support Professional Development within the sector
- Identifying and articulating future skill needs, including specialist skill areas
- Exploring and developing archaeological and heritage skills for new graduates

To better understand individual and sector skills needs in Northern Ireland, we have developed a skills survey which will be sent to individuals, employers and students. The working group is cochaired by Kate Geary and Cara Jones from the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists (CIfA) who will manage the data collection. CIfA is registered with the Information Commissioner to process personal data and complies with the principles of the Data Protection Act and GDPR.

Analysis of responses will be carried out by working group members from the Historic Environment Division of the Department for Communities.

Why are you processing my personal information?

No personal data is required during the survey. There is the potential that individuals may in error disclose personal data in the free text boxes. For this reason, we will treat this data as personal data.

We will process personal data provided in response to the survey for the purpose of seeking your views on your skills needs and/or those of your company and/or those of the sector. This will help us to better understand skills needs in Northern Ireland archaeology and find ways to meet them.

The answers submitted will be collated by HED staff who are members of the A2030 working group on Professional Skills, Training and Specialisms to form a report which will be used by the working group to inform the development of training and professional development opportunities. Individual survey responses will not be published but the report will be published on the Archaeology 2030 website.

Lawful basis for processing

The lawful basis we are relying on to process your personal data is Article 6(1)(e) of the UKGDPR, which allows us to process personal data when this is necessary for the performance of our duties as a professional body.

How long do you keep my personal data?

The personal data will be held for the purposes of writing a report and will then be deleted.

What rights do I have?

- You have the right to obtain confirmation that your data is being <u>processed</u>, and access to your personal data
- You are entitled to have personal data <u>rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete</u>
- You have a right to have personal data erased and to prevent processing, in specific circumstances
- You have the right to 'block' or suppress processing of personal data, in specific circumstances

- You have the right to data portability, in specific circumstances
- You have the right to object to the processing, in specific circumstances
- You have rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling
